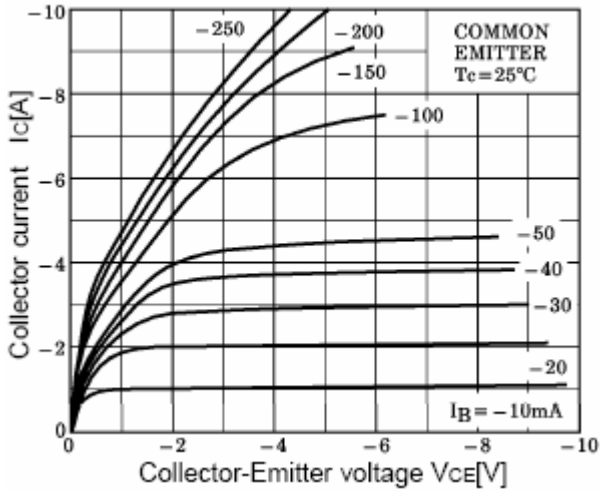

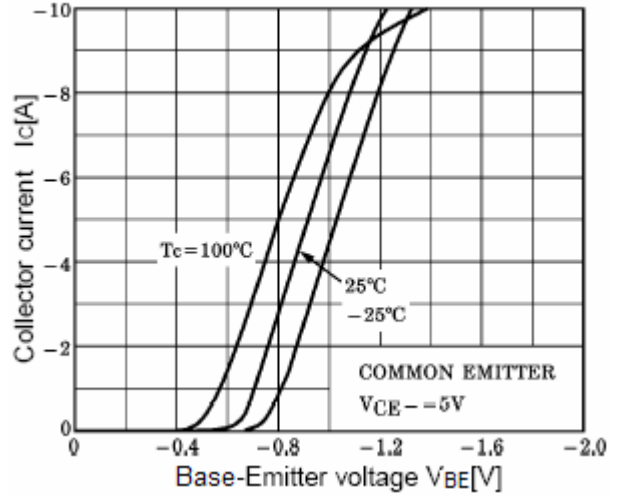

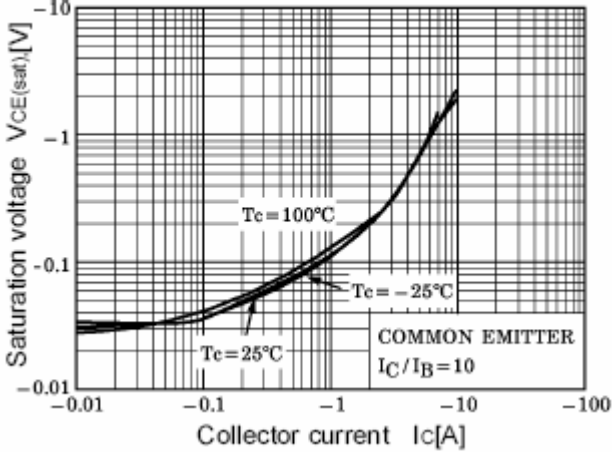
I_C - V_{CE} Characteristics



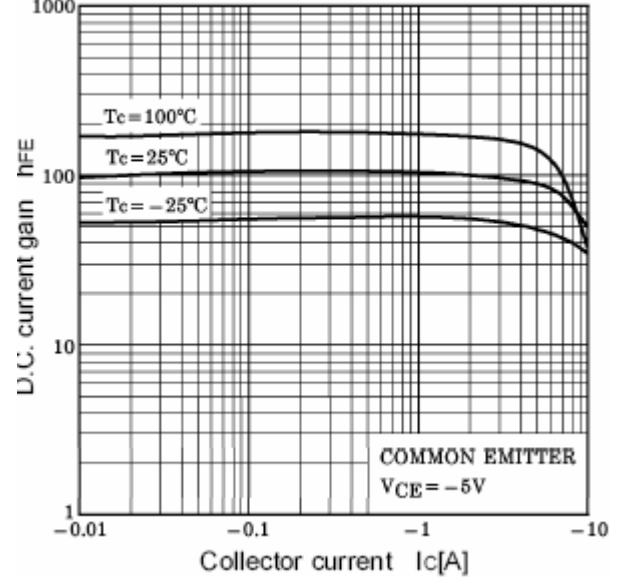
I_C - V_{BE} Characteristics
